

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT ... PEG "MISS PEG" BEDNARSKY: INNKEEPER AT HISTORIC INNS OF ANNAPOLIS

For more than four decades, Peg "Miss Peg" Bednarsky has been an icon at [Historic Inns of Annapolis](#) (opened 1727), and she is in many ways the very spirit of Annapolis. Over the past 40 years, she has worked for the Inns and has dedicated her life to serving locals, visitors, and legislators.

Her manner with visitors is delightful to see. She is informative, and her love and knowledge for Annapolis shines through in every conversation. Her motherly manner makes guests feel as they are a part of her family, and they carry her personal touch on with them for a lifetime.

The close proximity of the Inns to the State Capitol has allowed Miss Peg the opportunity to serve legislators, lobbyists, and reporters during the terms of six governors. Miss Peg works hard to provide a "home-away-from-home" environment for those who stay at the Inns during the legislative session. Additionally, Miss Peg has received numerous proclamations and citations from governors, a lieutenant governor, the Maryland Senate, and the Maryland House of Delegates. Some of the citations have referred to her as the "unofficial house mother" of the General Assembly.
